3 Floats: Tables, Figures, and Listings

Authors are required to place all tables, figures, and listings at the top of the page (preferably using the [!t] placement option). The reference to each table or figure in the main text must appear on the same page, or at most on the preceding page. References that appear on a subsequent page relative to the corresponding float (e.g., the figure is on page 3 and the reference appears first on page 4) should be avoided, as they disrupt the logical flow of reading and visual comprehension.

4 Tables

Tables can be inserted via the normal table and tabular environment. To put footnotes inside tables you should use `\footnotetext[]{\dots}` tag. The footnote appears just below the table itself (refer Tables 1 and 2). For the corresponding footnotemark use `\footnotemark[\dots]`

5 Figures

As per the \LaTeX standards you need to use eps images for \LaTeX compilation and pdf/jpg/png images for PDF \LaTeX compilation. This is one of the major difference between \LaTeX and PDF \LaTeX . Each

6 Listings

Source code or algorithmic examples should be included using the `listings` package. Listings must be clearly readable and, whenever possible, placed at the top of the page (`[!t]` option). The reference to each listing should appear on the same page or, at most, on the preceding page. References appearing on subsequent pages should be avoided. See, for example, Listing 1.

7 References

The Journal of Digital Terminology and Lexicography (JDTL) follows the **APA reference style**. All sources cited in the text must appear in the reference list, and all entries in the reference list must be cited in the text. References should be formatted according to the APA 7th edition guidelines, as implemented by the `sn-apacite` bibliography style.

Citations in the text should be made using the `\citep` or `\citet` commands, which produce parenthetical and narrative citations respectively. Example usage is shown below.

Example of parenthetical citations: This is a one author citation (Smith, 2020). This one is a two author citation (Doe & Johnson, 2019). While this is a three author citation without parentheses Taylor et al. (2018).
